**Justice Louis Sangiorgio
Supreme Court Law Intern Program**

The Richmond County Bar Association (RCBA) is now accepting applications for participating in its law intern program. The Bar Association will select up to six law students to participate in a six-week program, which will immerse them in the day-to-day business of the judicial system. Applicants must be residents of Staten Island.

Participating students will be assigned to work with Supreme Court Judges and court law assistants in the research and resolution of real life disputes, which have come before the court. Participants will observe jury trials, jury selection and litigant conferences with the court.

Student interns will be paid a \$1500 stipend for the six week program, which runs from Monday, June 5 through Friday, July 14, 2006.

Applications must be received by Monday, May 1, 2006.
